


Dear Friends,

Instead of moving forward on something everyone agrees on —cutting taxes on the middle class—Republicans in the House have instead chosen to double-down on their efforts to protect special tax breaks for the wealthy.



House Republicans are holding middle class tax cuts hostage so they can give tax breaks to the wealthiest 2%. This cynical hand-out to the rich would add \$930 billion to the national debt.

As it is, our tax code already favors billionaires and the largest corporations. That's why President Obama and Democrats in Congress have been working to cut taxes on the middle class and restore fairness to the tax code. In fact, the Democratic-controlled Senate has already passed the Obama tax cuts for 120 million families—promising lower taxes for fully 98% of all Americans and 97% of our small businesses.
